Good composition is a must! Be creative! Take as many shots as you need to get the right one. Don't just snap a picture of a door, decide what angle will make the door look most interesting.

Take turns shooting photos. Talk about the shot you're taking with your partner(s). Sign your initials next to each shot you take, as you take it, so you don't forget who did what.
