1 A visual food point or area toward which all visual movement is
1. A visual focal point or area toward which all visual movement is
directed; focus of visual attention, often different from the physical
center of the work
2. Differences in values, colors, textures, shapes and other elements;
creates visual excitement and adds interest.
3. Distribution of visual weight in a work of art.
4. Help artists to organize artwork so viewers are more comfortable
with the work. Include balance, contrast, emphasis, movement,
pattern, rhythm, and unity
5. Lines that show the edges of forms and shapes in the simplest way
 6. One of the most important aspects of well-designed art; a cohesive
quality that makes an artwork seem to be complete and finished;
elements look as if they belong together.
7. Ordered arrangement of elements in a work of art, usually
according to the principles of design; called visual design.
8. Repetition of visual movement—colors, shapes, or lines. Works
with movement to create the equivalent of a musical beat
9. Stretched out lengthwise; drawn in a way to exaggerate height or
length
 10. Style of art that shows objects, people, and/or places in simplified
arrangements of shape, line, texture, or color; often geometrical
11. The design principle of creating a focal point of greater stress and
making it the center of interest. Used by artists to create dominance
and focus in their work
12. Used by artists to direct viewers through their work, often to a focal
area
13. Uses the art elements in planned or random repetitions
14. Visual balance in which one side of the composition appears
different than the other side while remaining balanced.
15. Closely related to unity, elements organized into a visually pleasing
relationship.
16. Elements are repeated but do not seem planned or predictable; also
called random or unplanned
17. Artwork that has width and height; flat-work
18. Artwork that has depth, width and height

19. Design based on a circular arrangement, with the features radiating
from a central point.
